Third Sunday of Advent

In today's gospel John the Baptist is baptizing believers in the Jordan River (Jn 1:6-8, 19-28). He was a mighty man of God anointed to testify about Jesus, so that all may believe through him. Remember, when Jesus came with all his mighty works asking who do the people think I am? Some thought John the Baptist had returned. The manifestation of God's power through John caught the attention of the Jews in Jerusalem: they sent priests and Levites to inquire if he was Christ, Elijah, or the Prophet. He admitted he was not the Christ or either prophet. John identified as "the voice of one crying out in the desert, make straight the way of the Lord" (Is 40:3). Their questions were on track; John was identified later by Jesus as Elijah (Mt 17:12). John's answer is reminiscent of Jesus' answer to John about who he was not telling him directly but through scripture that referred to Him. "The blind receive their sight and the lame walk, lepers are cleansed and the deaf hear, and the dead are raised up, and the poor have good news preached to them. The Jews were baffled at why John baptized if he was not the Christ, Elijah, or the Prophet based on their knowledge of scripture. "I will sprinkle clean water upon you, and you shall be clean from all your uncleanness, and from all your idols I will cleanse you. A new heart I will give you, and a new spirit I will put within you; and I will take out of your flesh the heart of stone and give you a heart of flesh" (Ez 36:25-26). John replied I baptize with water but there is one unrecognized among you who "I am not worthy to untie" the strap of his sandal.

John preached the Good News and pointed everyone to Jesus. It is Rejoice Sunday, but joy can be buried beneath the weight of unrepented sin and not living for God. Experience the joy of going to Confession and live the baptismal promises to turn away from Satan, all his works, and empty promises and to believe and trust in the Father, Son, Holy Spirit, and the Church. Happiness is fleeting and comes from circumstances, but divine joy resides inside of us and comes from loving obedience to God. Embrace the habit of quickly turning away from sin in our daily actions to unleash divine joy accompanied by a heavenly satisfaction that pushes us to new heights in Christ. It produces a steadfastness that enables us to face anything with the assurance that God has our back. So that no matter what life throws at us, we can count it all joy as the apostles did (James 1:2-3). What change(s) can you make to uncover divine joy?
