

INFANT BAPTISMS

Instructions for infant Baptisms are on the first and third Thursday of the month (after initial registration) at 7:00 p.m. in the Church Hall.

Reflection 3rd Sunday in Ordinary Time

The gospel (Mk 1:14-20) begins with John the Baptist being imprisoned; he will soon lose his life. Then it describes the process of conversion: the call to come (believe), leave behind the old, and follow Jesus (learn and put into action), Jesus' ministry has begun in the region of Galilee which includes Nazareth, the town he grew up in. He proclaims the gospel of God: "This is the time of fulfillment. The kingdom of God is at hand. Repent, and believe in the gospel." The Jewish people had long-awaited this moment and suddenly it had arrived. As Jesus passed by the Sea of Galilee, he saw the brothers Simon and Andrew fishing with nets and said to them: "Come after me, and I will make you fishers of men." They believe, abandon their nets, and old life to follow him. The group walked further down the coast and saw James and John in a boat mending their nets. Jesus called to them; they responded to the power of his words, acknowledged his authority, and immediately left their father and the hired men to follow him. It could be said these apostles have left their careers for a new vocation and entered the seminary under the personal tutelage of Jesus.

Coming to Christ (conversion) requires turning away from the old ways and renewing the commitment to your new life and purpose in Christ. Some may leave their jobs, friends, and parents behind and prepare for the religious or priestly life. For many, this transformation translates into living our existing life for God better and allowing Him to gradually bring us out of the former ways into His new ways and purpose (wisdom of Christ). As we practice handling family matters His way, prayer, wisdom, and compassion increase. They become more automatic and show up in every area of our Proverbs 3:13-17 describe the benefits of life. pursuing this true wealth. "Happy is the man who finds wisdom, and the man who aets understanding, for the gain from it is better than gain from silver and its profit better than gold. She is more precious than jewels, and nothing you desire can compare with her. Long life is in her right hand; in her left hand are riches and honor. Her ways are ways of pleasantness, and all her paths are peace. She is a tree of life to those who lay hold of her; those who hold her fast are called happy." Is the Lord calling you into a deeper conversion?






