It is mandatory that parents and Godparents attend.


Reflection 4th Sunday in Ordinary Time

Today's gospel (Mark 1:21-28) takes place in the coastal fishing village of Capernaum on the shore of the Sea of Galilee; It was home to two of the disciples (Simon and Andrew) and was Jesus' current residence (Mk 1:29; 2:1). Jesus was known at the synagogue; any man well versed in the Scriptures could be invited to comment on the readings (Acts 13:14-15). Jesus delivers a powerful teaching that astonishes the people in attendance. He taught as one having authority; not as the scribes (offering opinions or passing on traditional interpretations). A man with an unclean spirit cried out asking Jesus if he had come to destroy him. The evil spirit identifies Jesus as "the Holy One of God" reinforcing His authoritative presence. Jesus commanded the spirit to be "quiet" and "come out of him." The spirit convulsed the man and left with a loud cry. All were amazed and asked one another if this was a new teaching with authority because even the unclean spirits obeyed him. Word of what happened spread everywhere throughout the region of Galilee.

Jesus came to set the captives free (Lk 4:18-19); his words were spoken with confidence knowing he was the Son of God. When he spoke, the people witnessed a manifestation of divine power that drove out evil. "So shall my word be that goes forth from my mouth: it shall not return to me empty, but it shall accomplish that which I purpose, and prosper in the thing for which I sent it." (Is 55:11). When the scriptures are read in mass and the homily is given, Jesus is speaking to us. Pray for these words to accomplish the work needed in your heart. Listen intently with faith. Meditate on any parts that seem to draw your attention. Ask the Holy Spirit for help and direction. Think and pray about the words whenever time permits, and you will experience the divine power of the word as the people of Capernaum did. "For the word of God is living and active, sharper than any twoedged sword, piercing to the division of soul and spirit, of joints and marrow, and discerning the thoughts and intentions of the heart (Heb 4:12). Are you ready to be astonished?


