



Reflection The Epiphany of the Lord

The Epiphany is the manifestation of Jesus as Messiah of Israel. Son of God and Savior of the world. He fulfilled God's promise to Abraham to bless all the nations of the earth through his descendants (Gen 22:18). The gospel (Mat 2:1-12) begins with the magi following a new star; it was widely believed a new star signified the birth of a new king. Logically, they look in the palace of King Herod and inquire about such a birth, explaining they have come to pay homage. The knowledge of another king threatens Herod's power and all in Jerusalem that hold influential positions in his kingdom for they fear being displaced. Herod investigates, finding Bethlehem as the birthplace of the Messiah and the approximate age of the child by acquiring the time of the star's appearance from the magi. King Herod hoped to deceive the magi into disclosing the child's location so he could kill him. After leaving Herod, the magi are overjoyed to see the star again and follow it until it stops directly over Jesus. They enter the house and see Mary and Jesus. Immediately they prostrate themselves. They present their royal treasures: gold representing kingship, frankincense, a symbol of divinity, and myrrh used in burial. Then they departed another way for an angel warned them not to return to Herod. Many evil plans exist in this world, but God's plan will always prevail just as it did in today's gospel.

It must have been a surprise to find a king in such humble surroundings, but through their travels they experience a personal epiphany inspiring true worship and recognition of His kingship and worthiness of royal gifts. There was no shortage of signs from heaven that this child was indeed special. Like the star that guided them, and it was well known in Bethlehem that a multitude of angels appeared giving glory to God for the child. Then an angel appeared to the magi in a dream warning them not to return to Herod and take another path home. Let us be inspired by the magi's journey today. It was not so much about the magi or the star but seeking and finding Christ on one path and leaving by another (conversion). Like the magi were not to return to Herod, we are not to return down the same path of our old lives. Saint Gregory the Great had wonderful insight into this passage for daily living; he said, the treasures signify the gifts we present to Christ in our daily lives. Gold is Christ's wisdom, which shines in us. frankincense is the prayer and adoration we give him, and myrrh is our daily self-sacrifices. Are you on the path of conversion?
