4th Sunday of Lent

In the gospel (Jn 3:14-21) Jesus teaches Nicodemus about the two paths available to mankind (light and darkness). He begins, just as Moses lifted up the image of the serpent on a pole so that the Israelites that looked upon it were healed from the punishment (snake bites) for their sin (Num 21:4-9). likewise, the Son of Man must be lifted up (crucified) so all who believe in Him might not perish but have eternal life. "For God so loved the world that he gave his only Son, so that everyone who believes in him might not perish but might have eternal life" (3:16). Jesus clearly states, "Whoever believes in him will not be condemned, but whoever does not believe has already been condemned," because they did not believe in the "name of the only Son of God." For belief leads to following the ways of Christ. Here is the verdict:: the light (Jesus) came into the world, but those who rejected Jesus chose darkness over light because their works were evil. The wicked hate the light and do not come toward it so their works are not exposed. Whoever "lives the truth" comes to the light (Jesus) so that "his works may be clearly seen as done in God." Coming to Jesus causes us to turn away from sin and embrace the way of love and imitation of Christ.

Today we see a pattern of belief in God's solution (the serpent pole and Christ). acknowledging sin (looking at the serpent pole and repentance), and redemption (healing and salvation through Christ). We are children of the light who are striving to "live the truth" (the Faith). We make many mistakes and wrong choices but bring them to Jesus by means of the Sacrament of Reconciliation. The Apostle John said, "but if anyone does sin, we have an advocate with the Father. Jesus Christ the righteous; and he is the expiation for our sins (1 Jn 2:1-2). The love of God the Father surpasses any love we have experienced here, and his fervent desire is that we have eternal life. We accept His gracious forgiveness and return to loving others "in deed and in truth (1 Jn 3:18). "This is his commandment, that we should believe in the name of his Son Jesus Christ and love one another" (1 Jn 3:18). Is there anything you need to bring to Jesus?




